Language characterized by: Leaving out or making errors with the little parts of language:

- prepositions
- pronouns
- am/is/are

Difficulty with

- correct word order
- telling coherent stories
- following directions
- learning new vocabulary
- word finding
- phonological awareness

Children with DLD often have a diagnosis of ADHD, dyslexia, learning disability, or behavior disorder.

DLD is often undiagnosed children receiving MTSS or Tier 2 supports may also be eligible.

Would my clients be eligible?

We screen children who:

- Are between 4-9 years old
- Have suspected difficulty with language learning
- Primarily speak & hear English
- Do not have a formal diagnosis of autism, intellectual disability or hearing impairment
- Have computer and internet access

Over referrals are welcome!
